## Compliance Status

This website is partially compliant with the requirements of Appendix A of the UNI CEI EN 301549 standard due to the cases of non-compliance and exemptions listed below.

## Inaccessible Content

The contents listed below are not accessible due to non-compliance with Law 9 January 2004, n.4:

- **1.1.1** – Some non-text content presented to the user does not have an equivalent text alternative that serves the same purpose.
- **1.3.1** – In some cases, information, structure, or relationships conveyed by the presentation of the pages cannot be programmatically determined (or are not available via text).
- **1.3.5** – Some fields do not have a clearly identified purpose in the code or do not programmatically have technologies that support the identification of the expected meaning of the data entered in the form.
- **1.4.1** – In some cases, color alone has been used to identify a purpose or distinguish information or a function.
- **1.4.3** – In some sections, the contrast between text and background may not reach the minimum recommended levels, making the text difficult for some users to read.
- **1.4.4** – Some text, except subtitles and images containing text, cannot be scaled up to 200 percent without using assistive technologies and without losing content and functionality.
- **1.4.5** – Alternative text consistent with images is not always present.
- **2.1.1** – Some functionalities cannot be used via keyboard (or similar input interface) and are difficult to activate without the use of a mouse.
- **2.1.2** – In some sections, it may not be possible to move focus from one component to another using only the keyboard, potentially trapping the user.
- **2.4.1** – Some pages may not have a mechanism to skip repeated content blocks, such as navigation menus or headers.

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- **2.4.3** – On some web pages that can be navigated sequentially and where the navigation sequence affects their meaning and operation, some objects that could receive focus do not receive it in an order that preserves their meaning and operability.
  - **2.4.4** – Generic links are present, e.g., "See all" or "Learn more."
  - **2.4.5** – In some sections, there may be no more ways to locate web pages within the site.
  - **2.4.6** – Headings and labels do not always accurately describe the topic or purpose.
  - **2.4.7** – The focus indicator is not visible on some interactive elements.
  - **2.5.3** - In some cases, the visual label of a user interface component may not be included in its accessible name, potentially making it difficult for users of voice-based assistive technologies to understand.
  - **3.3.2 – Labels or instructions:** for some fields, labels are not provided to meet a graphic and aesthetic choice.
  - **3.3.3** – If an insertion error is identified and suggestions for correcting it are known, such suggestions are not always provided to the user unless doing so would compromise the security or purpose of the content.
  - **4.1.1** – The markup code of the pages is not always compliant with its specifications or contains errors, or duplicate attributes and IDs.
  - **4.1.2** – In some cases, user interface components (including: form elements, links, and script-generated components), name, role, states, properties, and values are not correct or set, or the user and their assistive technologies are not notified when these change.
  - **4.1.3** – In some cases, status messages are not announced to assistive technologies, making it difficult or impossible for users with visual disabilities to perceive important information related to changes in the interface state (e.g., action confirmations, errors, notifications).

## Preparation of the accessibility statement

This declaration was drawn up on April 30 2026.

The information in the declaration was obtained from a self-assessment carried out directly by the service provider through objective and subjective analyses (cf. Article 3, paragraph 1, of Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/1523).
